OPENING PRAYER:

WRESTLING WITH THE WORD:1

- When do you feel like a grasshopper? What giants are you facing right now?
- Where are you in your spiritual life?

More to Ponder:

While serving as District Superintendent I often asked congregations what they were planning for the next year that could not be accomplished without God's intervention. The Bible is filled with stories of accomplishments that were achieved only as God's people sought, accepted, and invested power from beyond themselves, God's power to achieve their God-honored goals. Far too often we try to do far too much on our own, forgetting that there is help available from the One who made us, loves us, and walks with us in all of life's experiences. Today, instead of getting stressed out because I have too much to do, I will ask God to guide me in my yes and no to tasks and opportunities that come my way.
